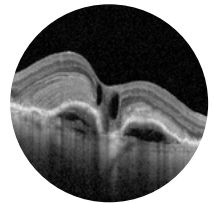

Jeremy Chiang introduces the anterior and posterior complications in eye cancer patients, and the side effects of anti-cancer drugs.



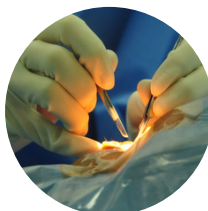

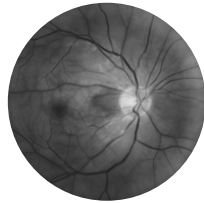

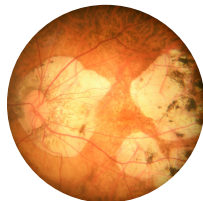


13 September 2022

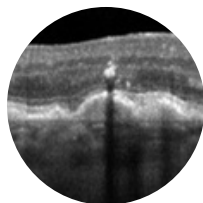


8 November 2022
